The office of Preservation of Fruits and Vegetables, Bureau of Markets, has been investigating the new method for several years and the investigators report that such fruits as strawberries, raspberries, loganberries, blue berries, currants, and cherries are now being frozen and held in commercial lots. So far as the process is concerned, this method of preservation has all the merits of simplicity. The fruit is frozen in the same crates in which it is marketed. The temperature required is about 10 degrees...

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
